

To schedule a time for your conference please:


- 1. Go to <u>www.myconferencetime.com/ccscoyotes/</u>



We get to adopt a Harp Seal! Thank you, NYMRC!

Hello, everyone!

Exciting news! Thanks to our partnership with the New York Marine Rescue Center for this year's Walk-a-thon, we have been given a Harp seal to adopt! We will get to see his release in early April via a school-wide Live Stream! Another cool thing is that we get to name our seal - the naming theme is "fruits and veggies"! I can't wait to see what we choose! Please take a look at the name options and select your favorite 5! We will have a second round of voting once we narrow these 15 name choices down! Enjoy the fun! Here is a little background about our very own pup: On the evening of February 14th, 2025, NYMRC received a call to their 24-hour standing hotline regarding a pup at Jones Beach in Suffolk County. A team of MYMRC biologists responded to the seal and a male, Harp seal pup was seen on the beach eating sand and appeared dehydrated. He was transported back to the NYMRC hospital facility for a complete physical. Upon completing the physical, he was confirmed to be underweight, dehydrated, and had a heavy parasite load.

During the time of his rehabilitation, biologists offered enrichment daily and kept him happy, engaged and not bored! The average stay for each animal is about six-eight weeks. Our donation from the Walk-a-thon helped to defray the cost of food, medication and treatment expenses. We are so excited that our Harp Seal will be able to return to his natural habitat at the start of April. It's going to be such a celebration and wonderful moment to witness as a school community!

As I have more information, I will share! Extra thanks to Wendy McFarlane, who connected our school with the NYMRC and who volunteers her time there! Please enjoy our certificate from the NYMRC and some pictures and a video of our Harp Seal (can't wait to find out what his name will be)!



WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH



Arethusa Farm 4-H Camp

A partnership of the Arethusa Farm Foundation & Litchfield County 4-H

Litchfield County UConn 4-H is proud to announce their partnership with the Arethusa Farm Foundation to provide local youth **ages 5 to 13** as of January 1, 2025 with a variety of Agriculture Summer Camp experiences during the summer of 2025. A common goal of both organizations is to increase agricultural literacy among local youth so they understand the importance of agriculture, farming, local food and the environment.

Our 2025 Agriculture Summer Camp experience is a state-approved day camp run by professional educators and 4-H youth leaders with support of the Arethusa Farm Foundation sharing their extensive farm property with Litchfield County 4-H for this unique opportunity for learning.





What is 4-H?

UConn 4-H is the youth development program of UConn Extension. As part of the University of Connecticut, 4-H has access to research-based, ageappropriate information needed to help youth reach their full potential. The mission of 4-H is to assist all youth ages 5-18 in acquiring knowledge, developing leadership and life skills while forming mindsets that will enable them to become self-directing, productive and contributing members of their families and communities.

Arethusa Farm Foundation

The Arethusa Farm Foundation is a newly established not-for-profit 501(c)3 entity created to receive from Mr. Anthony Yurgaitis the gift of a portion of the premises of Arethusa Farm which he and his late partner, George Malkemus, previously operated as a high-quality dairy farm. The Foundation's primary goal is to establish an agricultural education center for elementary, middle and high school students, 4-H members and to the wider community as a whole.

Do you love animals? If you love animals or think about a career in veterinary medicine. This camp is for you! Handson interactions with farm animals and pets, both large and small, create a unique learning experience as students are introduced to the amazing world of animal science. Campers will learn about the skills used in real-world veterinary medicine for a fun, interactive, and educational experience. Cows, goats, sheep, pigs, rabbits, chickens, and horses are just some of the animals that you'll be introduced to, as you learn about anatomy, safe handling during examinations, identifying disease, treatments, and illness prevention. Immerse yourself in a veterinarian's daily rounds, as we cover nutrition, dentistry, and practice emergency response treatments. You can even learn to suture! Discover what a day in a veterinarian's life might entail as professional guest speakers visit our classes to share their experiences, along with the fundamental concepts and current issues in veterinary medicine. Enjoy this incredible enrichment opportunity to increase your knowledge in keeping animals healthy and happy as you explore a possible veterinary career and a life filled with animals!

Would you like to expand your knowledge about farm animals? Plan on getting your hands dirty caring for our farm animals and working around the farm. Learn facts and fiction about the many breeds of animals found in farming operations. But it's not all work and no play! A new discovery is waiting to happen surrounded by baby animals. The lambs, kids, foal, piglets, calf or kits all inspire the learning as we dive into the rhythm of farm life. This hands-on experience helps campers to understand that each animal has unique characteristics, eating habits, health requirements and seasonal needs to keep them safe and happy. Explore poultry power collecting eggs or watch chicks hatch and grow from eggs to legs. Dig a little deeper to cultivate a stronger appreciation for sustainable farming in our educational gardens filled with honeybees and pollinators. Build an understanding of how vital their role is in producing food that feeds us all. Soak up the sun, make new friends, replace screen time with fresh air and get ready for an unforgettable agriculture adventure!




